NPC is a not-for-profit organisation that was established 10 years ago. Being a not-for-profit organisation means we reinvest any profit back into patient services.

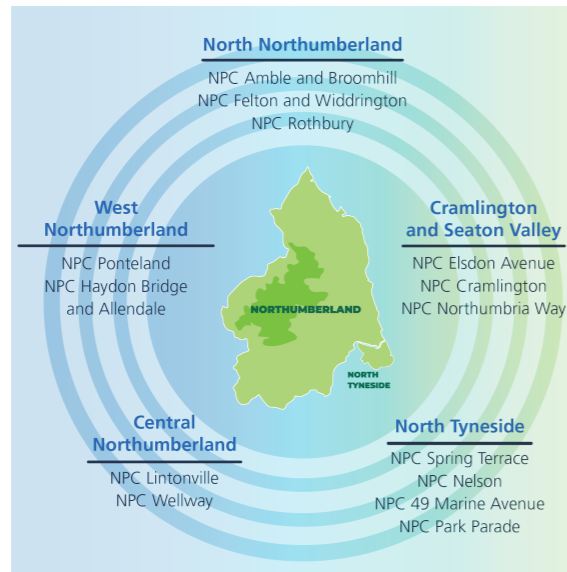

By working collaboratively across multiple practices, we:

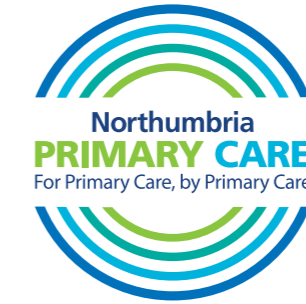
- Improve access to GP services, ensuring timely care for patients.

As promised at the NPC Felton update sessions we held in the village in the summer, here is some information about Northumbria Primary Care (NPC) and NPC Felton surgery. We hope you find it useful.

We appreciate that patients and residents have concerns about the provision at our surgery in Felton village, and we would like to assure you that we are doing what we can to increase this.

We are moving into an exciting time for the surgery as we plan for the refurbishment, which will hopefully begin in February next year. As we move into this new era, it is important to us that we also strengthen the connection and relationship with our patients and restore trust. The way primary care is delivered is ever-changing, and we need to be able to adapt to this. This includes how GPs and other clinicians work.

## NPC Felton refurbishment

As discussed at our update sessions, we know that people are disappointed that we aren't going to build a new surgery. As custodians of public money, this option became unaffordable. Other options included closing the surgery in Felton, having a mobile unit/surgery or purchasing Dr and Mrs Horner's property and refurbishing it into a modern and fit-for-purpose GP practice.

By choosing the last option, we are retaining primary care services in the village, which we know is important to you...and to us too. This option is affordable as we will be able to utilise the section 106 money from Bellway, which is secured.

We will ensure you are all kept up to date in relation to the progress of the refurbishment – updated information will be available on the website and via your local patient participation group (PPG). We will be sending an update out next month and organising a face-to-face drop-in session in December.

## Your NPC Felton PPG

We are working closely with the NPC Felton PPG, so it is really important that you give them any feedback in relation to services and our new practice. We are also very keen to understand which community and voluntary services could support and benefit the local community.
